Rosella Mangion is legal officer with the Office of Legal Affairs, INTERPOL, working on illicit trade issues specifically within the Legal and Institutional Pillar of INTERPOL's Trafficking in Illicit Goods and Counterfeiting Programme. In the course of her work she has been involved in high level negotiations representing INTERPOL for two fundamental international treaties in the area of illicit trade, both which were adopted within some months of each other, the Protocol to Eliminate the Illicit Trade of Tobacco Products and the Arms Trade Treaty. She has presented on the topic of illicit trade at a number of international conferences including INTERPOL's International Law Enforcement IP Crime Conference in Panama 2012, the 7<sup>th</sup> Global Congress on Combatting Counterfeiting and Piracy in Istanbul 2013, before France's Assemblée Nationale (Parliament) on the arms trade last year, and the International Tax and Investment Centre's Anti-Illicit Trade Conference in 2013, amongst other international and national events. She is a legal trainer for capacity building and training programmes organized by INTERPOL around the world on the topic of illicit trade and counterfeiting, particularly in relation to prosecutorial issues, and has also co-authored articles titled "INTERPOL: a partner in curbing the illicit tobacco trade" published in Australia's Transnational Dispute Management Journal, and "Prosecuting Counterfeit Offences and Organized Crime: the Need for a Creative Legal Approach" in the World Trademark Review. Prior to INTERPOL, Rosella Mangion was a Solicitor for Public Prosecutions in New South Wales, Australia, for a number of years, giving her practical, first-hand knowledge of legal frameworks, procedure, policy and politics when prosecuting this type of crime. She was also an in-house Solicitor for Australia's Department of Finance and Deregulation.
